I have had so much fun and got so many good new friends, that I'd like to recommend Erasmus+-project to everyone,

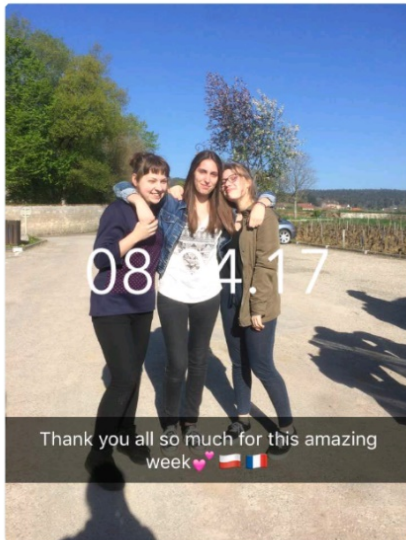

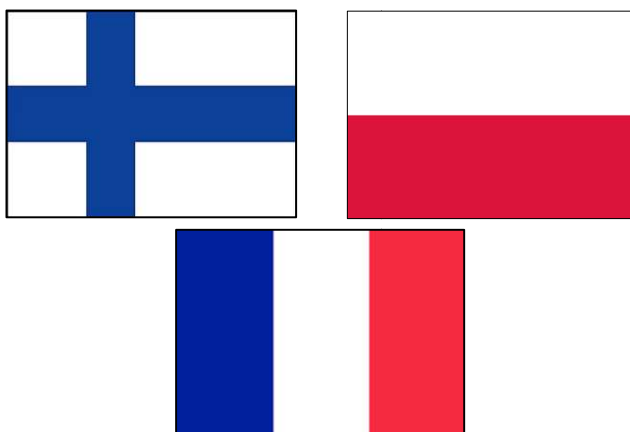
