

I wrote this article on Thursday...

As it is known, state New Jersey is a mine of the rad bands. There are countless of them; the horror punk legends like *The Misfits*, more popular ones like *My Chemical Romance* or more obscure ones – *The Banner*, *The Early November*, *Old Wounds* or (actually gaining popularity) *Thursday*. And I'm here to talk about that last one because they deserve to be listened to by everyone who would simply need it as I do.

Thursday represents the fourth wave of post-hardcore scene (is classified also as alternative rock, screamo or emotional hardcore). The band was formed in New Brunswick in 1997 by *Geoff Ricky* on vocals, *Tom Keeley* as lead guitarist, *Bill Henderson* on rhythm guitar (replaced by *Steve Pendula* after releasing their debut album), *Tim Payne* on bass and *Tucker Rule* as a drummer. They started with playing basement shows surrounding their state and the nearest area – New York. They recorded demos of their first songs which they had played before releasing "*Waiting*" in 1999 on which the songs from EP "1999 Summer Tour" would be also found (except for "*Mass As Shadows*"). The first *Thursday* song ever is called "*This Side of Brightness*" and... it really sounds like summer '99 – like the beginning of the new century. You can easily hear that the style of music they play is influenced by the bands like Fugazi, Sunny Days Real Estate (textbook example of midwest emo), At The Drive-in or Sigur Rós.



I will quickly get through their discography to give an outline of the work of this simple named band (simple and accidentally, they literally decided to name their group *Thursday* because that world was written on a tape of some rehearsals on the day of recording). As I mentioned before, their debut album "*Waiting*" was released in 1999. It wasn't loud about this project – release just happened; without any singles or support from television or radio.

Their second album "Full Collapse" (2001), featuring more popular songs like "Understanding In A Car Crash" or the masterpiece called "Autobiography Of A Nation" (which I have had on repeat lately) enabled them to perform during famous Warped Tour. But nevertheless, these times weren't the best for the band because signing to label meant the problems with "time to run everything by the band". The tense situation between Thursday and the huge company which was the Victory Records" created "Five Stories Falling" EP very soon. You can find only one new single on that record – "Jet Black New Year" recorded with MCR's Gerard Way on backing vocals. As regards the specifics, the next album was produced by another label – Island Records.

Their following material grows out from the experience of tragedy of the 21st century – from the terrorist attacks on World Trade Center of September 11. This historical event shook the world, especially the east-coast's kids who lived there. "War All the Time" (2003) was believed to be the political album comparing the world's war past (or simply reality?) on terrorism. As Rickly said himself, the purpose of the recording was rather to present the love being a war. However, the songs like "Division St." or "For the Workforce, Drowning" help to realize the catastrophic historical nature of civilization.

On the next album the vocalist vented his poetry passion by titling this record "A City by the Light Divided" (2006) which is combination of two lines from "Sustone" by Octavio Paz. And come on, who calls their song "The Lovesong Writer" if they don't like poetry? This releasing began a very generous period of touring, making friends of scene and using MySpace. They also shared with the world their demos, unreleased songs (like "Ladies And Gentlemen, My Brother, The Failure"), footage of live performances and documentary on the occasion of appearing of compilation "Kill the House Lights" on CD and DVD.

They changed the label again (Epitaph Records) and announced "Common Existence". This change enabled them to be more socially conscious and politically active. As the leader of Thursday explained, title refers to humanity's shared experience. The songs refer to numerous literary inspirations of band members – for example, "Resuscitation of a Dead Man" is influenced by Denis Johnson's "Resuscitation of a Hanged Man".

Last but not least, 2011 is the year of releasing "No Devolución". The style was to be back to the roots - more vulnerable and atmospheric as it is easily heard. Then Thursday disbanded and some members started working on side projects. Without going into details, I would say that band reunited few years later and then broke up again to announce definite return in 2020. But since 2011 they haven't released any new single. Their return is to give concerts around the world and giving second life to their old recordings which, I would definitely say, they're doing even better than expected. What I value the most in this band is instrumental consonance. As a guitarist, I devote the most attention to listening to guitar parts which seriously give the sound of the turn of the 20th and 21st centuries. The style is typically post-hardcore with driving distorted riffs, bouncy rhythms (so New Jersey), moving melodies and unique tone. They also don't shun the grip of acoustic guitars. The loud bass levels are also worth mentioning because Tim Payne proves that playing bass is not a piece of cake. What's more? The drummer is definitely killing it every time with his inconceivable amounts of energy. Put all this together, we have a band that has helped many people survive their youth with their raw, even angsty and simply powerful sound. And I didn't even start talking about vocals (spoiler)! Like, there are also violin parts on the first album. It is just crazy... and amazing.

Here I'm going to talk away about Geoff Rickly's role in *Thursday*. This guy is a poet (and also the writer, he has released the book "*Someone Who Isn't Me*" a few month ago) – the lyrics of every songs are full of emotions, of reflections of love, loneliness, work of the world, changes in society (actually about lack of change) and many important issues that deal with modern man. Undoubtedly they're relatable for all of us – his emotional vocals and unusual screams are the voice of the community of people who are given to live now.

I decided to write about this band because they're not just the creators of my favorite music but also my saviors and the ones who understand what's going on - they're afraid of the same thing that I fear, they don't leave me alone with a broken heart and uncertainties. Thursday is the people who gave me "hope that we will make it through".

Max Verstappen: Three-Time World Champion!

The long-awaited last song of the legendary band The Beatles will be released soon.

The song "Now and Then", created by John Lennon at home in the late 1970s, has taken on a fuller shape thanks to new technology. The premiere is on November 2 at 3 p.m. According to the band's living musicians, this is the last composition by The Beatles.

"It's not like we're pretending. It's really John's voice, Paul's voice and bass, George [Harrison] on rhythm guitar and me on drums," Ringo Starr told Variety in July of this year.

A demo of this song came into McCartney's hands in 1994, when Yoko Ono gave him a cassette of Lennon's 1980 recordings titled "For Paul". The demos were recorded on a piano in John Lennon's New York apartment. A year later, the song was considered to be released as an addition to "Anthology", but due to the poor quality of the recording, the idea was abandoned. Thanks to the technological revolution that has taken place over the last three decades, Lennon's vocal track has been refined and distortion-free.
